**ACT NO. 91-2017** by Mrs. Stockman

**RE-ESTABLISHING INVESTMENT POLICY AND GUIDELINES**

Pursuant to Section 212 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, Act 352-1994, as amended by Act 322-2002, adopted the Cattaraugus County Investment Policy and Guidelines, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to update, amend and re-establish the aforementioned Investment Policy, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that effective immediately, the Cattaraugus County Investment Policy and Guidelines is hereby amended, and as amended, is hereby re-established as follows:

**CATTARAUGUS COUNTY  
INVESTMENT POLICY AND GUIDELINES**

The objectives of the Cattaraugus County Investment Policy are as follows, in priority order:

1. to conform with all applicable federal, state and other legal requirements (legal);
2. to adequately safeguard principle (safety);
3. to provide sufficient liquidity to meet all operating requirements (liquidity); and
4. to obtain a reasonable rate of return (yield).

All investments made pursuant to this investment policy shall comply with the following conditions:

1. PRUDENCE.

1.1 All participants in the investment process shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust and shall avoid any transactions that might impair public confidence in the County of Cattaraugus to govern effectively.

1.2 Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then

prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion, and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the safety of the principal, as well as the probable income, to be derived.

1.3 All participants involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions.

2. DIVERSIFICATION. It is the policy of the County to diversify its deposits and investments by financial institution, by investment instrument, and by maturity scheduling, whenever possible. Furthermore, the County shall avoid having bank balances in excess of \$35,000,000 with any one institution.

3. INTERNAL CONTROLS. The County Treasurer is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that deposits and investments are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly, and are managed in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

4. COLLATERALIZING OF DEPOSITS. In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of the General Municipal Law, all deposits of the County, including certificates of deposit and special time deposits, in excess of the amount insured under the provisions of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act shall be secured:

4.1 By a pledge of "eligible securities" with an aggregate "market value" as provided by General Municipal Law, equal to the aggregate amount of deposits from the categories designated in the Appendix to this policy.

4.2 By an eligible "irrevocable letter of credit" issued by a qualified bank other than the bank with the deposits in favor of the government for a term not to exceed 90 days with an aggregate value equal to 140% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any. A qualified bank is one whose commercial paper and other unsecured short-term debt obligations are rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization or by a bank that is in compliance with applicable federal minimum risk-based capital requirements.

4.3 By an eligible surety bond payable to the government for an amount at least equal to 100% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any, executed by an insurance company authorized to do business in New York State, whose claims-paying ability is rated in the highest rating category by at least two national recognized statistical rating organization.

5. SAFEKEEPING AND COLLATERALIZATION

5.1 Eligible securities used for collateralizing deposits shall be held by a custodial bank or trust company subject to security and custodial agreements.

5.2 The security agreement shall provide that eligible securities are being pledged to secure County deposits together with agreed upon interest, if any, and any costs or expenses arising out of the collection of such deposits upon default. It shall also provide the conditions under which the securities may be sold, presented for payment, substituted or released and the events which will enable the County to exercise its rights against the pledged securities. In the event that the securities are not registered or inscribed in the name of the County, such securities shall be delivered in a form suitable for transfer or with an assignment in blank to the County or its custodial bank.

5.3 The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company,

or agent of and custodian for, County, be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement should also describe that the custodian shall confirm the receipt, substitution, or release of the securities. The agreement shall provide for the frequency of revaluation of eligible securities and for the substitution of securities when a change in the rating of a security may cause ineligibility. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

5.4 Securities pledged as collateral for County deposits shall be monitored no less frequently than monthly.

## 6. PERMITTED INVESTMENTS

6.1 As authorized by law, the County authorizes the Treasurer to invest monies not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:

- 6.1.1 Special time deposit accounts;
- 6.1.2 Certificates of deposit;
- 6.1.3 Obligations of the United States of America;
- 6.1.4 Obligations of the State of New York;
- 6.1.5 Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States of America where the principal and interest are guaranteed by the United States of America;
- 6.1.6 Any other eligible security listed on the attached appendix.

6.2 Only Reserve funds may be invested in obligations of the County.

6.3 All other County officials receiving money in their official capacity must deposit such funds in negotiable order of withdrawal accounts.

6.4 All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within such times as it is anticipated the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for purposes for which the monies were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within two years of the date of purchase.

7. AUTHORIZED FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND DEALERS. The County shall maintain a list of financial institutions and dealers approved for investment purposes. All financial institutions with which the local government conducts business must be credit worthy. Banks shall provide their most recent Consolidated Report of Condition (Call Report) at the request of the County. Security dealers not affiliated with a bank shall be required to be classified as reporting dealers affiliated with the New York Federal Reserve Bank, as primary dealers. The County Treasurer is responsible for evaluating the financial position and maintaining a listing of proposed depositories, trading partners and custodians. Such listing shall be evaluated at least annually.

## 8. PURCHASE OF INVESTMENTS

8.1 The Treasurer is authorized to contract for the purchase of investments:

- 8.1.1 Directly, including through a repurchase agreement, from an authorized trading partner;
- 8.1.2 By participation in a cooperative investment program with another authorized governmental entity pursuant to Article 5G of the General Municipal Law, where such program meets all the requirements set forth in the Office of the State Comptroller Opinion No. 88-46, and the specific program has been authorized by the County Legislature; and

8.1.3 By utilizing an on-going investment program with an authorized trading partner pursuant to a contract authorized by the County Legislature.

8.2 All purchased obligations, unless registered or inscribed in the name of the County, shall be purchased through, delivered to and held in the custody of a bank or trust company. Such obligations shall be purchased, sold or presented for redemption or payment by such bank or trust company only in accordance with prior written authorization from the County Treasurer. All such transactions shall be confirmed in writing to the County by the bank or trust company. Any obligation held in the custody of a bank or trust company shall be held pursuant to a written custodial agreement as described in General Municipal Law Section 10.

8.3 The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, as agent of and custodian for the County, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement shall describe how the custodian shall confirm the receipt and release of the securities. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

## 9. REPURCHASE AGREEMENTS

9.1 Repurchase agreements are authorized subject to the following restrictions:

9.1.1 All repurchase agreements must be entered into subject to a Master Repurchase Agreement.

9.1.2 Trading partners are limited to banks or trust companies authorized to do business in New York State and primary reporting dealers.

9.1.3 Obligations shall be limited to obligations of the United States of America and obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States of America.

9.1.4 No substitution of securities will be allowed.

9.1.5 The custodian shall be a party other than the trading partner.

## 10. OPERATIONS, AUDIT, AND REPORTING

10.1 The Treasurer or the Deputy Treasurer shall authorize the purchase and sale of all securities and certificates of deposit on behalf of the County. Oral directions concerning the purchase or sale of securities shall be confirmed in writing. The County shall pay for purchased securities upon the delivery or book-entry thereof.

10.2 The County will encourage the purchase and sale of securities and certificates of deposit through a competitive or negotiated process involving telephone solicitation of at least three bids for each transaction for investments exceeding a two week period.

10.3 At the time independent auditors conduct the annual audit of the accounts and financial affairs of the County, the independent auditors shall audit the investments of the County for compliance with the provisions of these Investment Guidelines.

10.4 Within 60 days of the end of each of the first three quarters of the fiscal year, the County Treasurer shall prepare and submit to the Finance Committee of the County Legislature a quarterly investment report which indicates new investments, the inventory of existing investments, and other such matters as the Treasurer deems appropriate.

10.5 Within 120 days of the end of the fiscal year, the Treasurer shall prepare and submit to the Finance Committee an annual investment report; recommendations for change in these Investment Guidelines; the investment income record; a list of total fees, commissions or other charges, if any, paid to a Custodial Bank and other such matters as the Treasurer deems appropriate.

10.6 The County Legislature shall review this Investment Policy and Guidelines annually.

10.7 The provisions of this Investment Policy and Guidelines, and any amendments hereto,

shall take effect prospectively, and shall not invalidate the prior selection of any Custodial Bank or prior investment.

APPENDIX  
Schedule of Eligible Securities

- (1) Obligations issued, or fully insured or guaranteed as to the payment of principal and interest, by the United States of America, an agency thereof or a United States government sponsored corporation.
- (2) Obligations partially insured or guaranteed by any agency of the United States of America, at a proportion of the Market Value of the obligation that represents the amount of the insurance or guaranty.
- (3) Obligations issued or fully insured or guaranteed by the State of New York, obligations issued by a municipal corporation, school district or district corporation of such state or obligations of any public benefit corporation which under a specific state statute may be accepted as security for deposit of public monies.
- (4) Obligations issued by states (other than the State of New York) of the United States rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (5) Obligations of Puerto Rico rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (6) Obligations of counties, cities and other governmental entities of a state other than the State of New York having the power to levy taxes that are backed by the full faith and credit of such governmental entity and rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (7) Any mortgage related securities, as defined by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, which may be purchased by banks under the limitations established by bank regulatory agencies.
- (8) Commercial paper and bankers' acceptances issued by a bank, other than the Bank, rated in the highest short term category by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization and having maturities of not longer than 60 days from the day they are pledged.
- (9) Zero coupon obligations of the United States government marketed as Treasury Strips.

WHEREAS, due to the need to continue this infrastructure program, the additional 1% sales tax should be extended for a term commencing December 1, 2017 through November 30, 2019, and

WHEREAS, there should be an exemption for home heating fuels from this additional 1% sales tax, and

WHEREAS, a necessity exists for the passage of such legislation by the New York State Legislature, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby requests the New York State Legislature adopt special legislation to amend such laws, including the New York State Tax Law, to authorize the Cattaraugus County Legislature to extend the additional 1% sales tax, for a term commencing December 1, 2017 and terminating November 30, 2019, and be it further

#### **DESIGNATION OF CIVIL RIGHTS COORDINATOR**

Pursuant to 42 USC Section 2000d and the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

WHEREAS, Cattaraugus County has always assured that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender or gender identity, sexual orientation, or disability provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (P.L. 100.259), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Executive Order 13166, and

WHEREAS, Cattaraugus County further assures that every effort has been, is being, and will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its programs and activities, whether those programs and activities are federally funded or not, and

WHEREAS, the rights and needs of people with disabilities are matters of vital concern to the County of Cattaraugus, and it is necessary to provide for greater cooperation, communication, and coordination of functions and services on a county-wide basis, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County's Compliance Officer is hereby designated and appointed as the Civil Rights Coordinator by the Chairman of the Legislature, and as such, shall report to, and be directly accountable to the County Administrator, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Civil Rights Coordinator shall be responsible for the following:

- a. coordinating, implementing and enforcing all civil rights programs applicable to Cattaraugus County, including, without limitation, those identified in the first Whereas paragraph hereof and those affecting persons having Limited English Proficiency (LEP);
- b. attending and conducting trainings regarding Title VI, Limited English Proficiency (LEP), Environmental Justice (EJ) and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA);
- c. assisting in civil rights compliance, investigations, auditing, monitoring, and reporting obligations for each County department;
- d. reviewing program area policies, announcements, manuals and written procedures, and making recommendations to the County Legislature regarding the implementation of such policies and plans;
- e. acting as the liaison between the County and public and private agencies, organizations and individuals in the development of programs affecting people's civil rights;
- f. providing a means of communication among people with disabilities and people of protected classes, the County Administrator, public and private agencies and the community at large;
- g. assisting County agencies in compiling demographic and statistical data regarding the number of people with disabilities, LEP, or of protected classes within the County in order to develop appropriate policies and programs;

- 
- h. accepting, logging, investigating and responding to all complaints or grievances alleging an adverse impact suffered by a person interacting with the County based on a protected factor;
  - i. in conducting investigations, the Civil Rights Coordinator is authorized to review documents, systems, and communications, and question employees in order to complete reports and recommendations; and
  - j. providing assistance to people with civil rights issues through the provision of information and referral services, and by facilitating the resolution of complaints concerning services and the administrative actions of County agencies and others.
