**AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE SUPPLEMENTAL CONTRACT WITH NYSDOT FOR
2014 BRIDGE WASHING AND DECK SEALING FEDERAL-AID PROJECT**

Pursuant to Title 23 U.S. Code and
Section 450 of the County Law.

- I. WHEREAS, Act 32-2014 authorized a contract with NYSDOT for participation in the 2014 Bridge Washing and Deck Sealing project, and
- II. WHEREAS, the Cattaraugus County Bridge Washing and Deck Sealing Project, including 219 bridges in various towns, in Cattaraugus County, PIN 5760.52 (the "Project"), is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the costs of such program to be borne at a ratio of 80% federal funds and 20% non-federal funds, and
- III. WHEREAS, the County desires to advance the above Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of the Construction & Construction Inspection phases of the Project, now, therefore, be it
 - I. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby approves the above-described Project, and be it further
 - II. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby authorizes the County of Cattaraugus to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal shares of the cost of the Construction & Construction Inspection phases of the Project or portions thereof, and be it further
 - III. RESOLVED, that the sum of \$320,000.00 is hereby appropriated and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project, and be it further
 - IV. RESOLVED, that in the event the amount required to pay the full federal and non-federal shares of the cost of the Project's Construction & Construction Inspection phases exceeds the amount appropriated above, the County of Cattaraugus shall convene its Legislature as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by NYSDOT, and be it further
 - V. RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute all necessary documents, on behalf of Cattaraugus County, with NYSDOT in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of Project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefor that are not so eligible, and be it further
 - VI. RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary agreement in connection with the Project, and be it further
 - VII. RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

**URGING NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE TO PROVIDE FUNDING
IN 2015-2016 BUDGET FOR COMPLETION OF ROUTE 219**

Pursuant to Section 153 of the County Law.

I. WHEREAS, the completion of U.S. Route 219 as an expressway would provide a critical link between Erie County and the northern US border and the trade routes south through Pennsylvania and beyond, and

II. WHEREAS, the project, once complete, will increase safety for motorists, promote economic development, and provide a much needed north-south transportation route, making Western New York a destination location for businesses, and

III. WHEREAS, the estimated cost for the completion of the Route 219 expressway project is \$700 million, 80% of which would be funded by the federal government and 20% by New York State, and

IV. WHEREAS, out of such total, the cost to complete the section of Route 219 which runs approximately 1.66 miles from the rail yard in Salamanca to I-86, including a one mile long viaduct over the Allegheny River, would be approximately \$95 million, and

V. WHEREAS, the state's share of the cost for this section would be an estimated \$20 million plus \$7 million to complete the required SEQRA reviews, and the Federal share would be approximately \$80 million, and

VI. WHEREAS, since the above-described section of highway connects with I-86 and carries other benefits beyond completion of the Route 219 expressway, it is known to have "independent utility", and

VII. WHEREAS, according to the US Census from 2009 - 2013, 17.9% of Cattaraugus County residents live below the poverty line, and

VIII. WHEREAS, the county-wide median household income is \$42,603.00, which is more than \$15,000.00 below the statewide median, and

IX. WHEREAS, with an unemployment rate of over six (6%) percent, Cattaraugus County has a significant and compelling need for economic investment and development, and

X. WHEREAS, investing a portion of the \$5.2 billion secured by the State through the settlement of claims against banks and other purveyors of sub-prime loans into infrastructure projects which create long-term economic development is critical to boosting the economy in Cattaraugus County and the Western New York region as a whole, and

XI. WHEREAS, completion of Route 219, especially the section over the river from the Salamanca rail yard to I-86, is an important step toward the fulfillment of this mission, now, therefore, be it

I. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby urges Governor Cuomo and the New York State Legislature to join together in support of this critical project and provide the necessary funding for it

in the 2015-16 State Budget, and be it further
