APPLICANT CONVICTED OF SEX OFFENSE REVIEW FORM

New York Senate Bill S1885C-2013 was signed into law by Governor Cuomo on August 4, 2014, and took effect December 2, 2014. This law requires all fire companies to screen new applicants and transfer firefighters for previous sex offenses before accepting the applicant or transfer as a member. Part of the law provides for required factors of consideration to be fulfilled when considering an applicant or transfer firefighter with a sex offense conviction. Below are the factors set forth in the law, marked as we reviewed them while screening the applicant listed below:
