## AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE LEASE AGREEMENT WITH CATTARAUGUS COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICES BOARD AND OLEAN MEDICAL PRACTICE, PLLC, FOR DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES OFFICE SPACE

Pursuant to Section 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, Act 328-2021 authorized a lease agreement with the Olean Medical Group, LLP, 535 Main Street, Olean, New York 14760, for the leasing of general medical office space and access to common area space in its facility for individual counseling services to children, adolescents and adults at the Olean Medical Group, the term of which expired August 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, the Cattaraugus County Community Services Board is desirous of continuing the lease of the aforementioned space, and

WHEREAS, the Olean Medical Group, LLP is now known as the Olean Medical Practice, PLLC, and

WHEREAS, the Olean Medical Practice, PLLC, shall lease approximately 153 square feet of general medical space and grant access to approximately 1,890 square feet of common area space in its facility to the Cattaraugus County Community Services Board for an amount as follows:

Nov 1, 2023 – Oct 31, 2024 \$2,754.00 Nov 1, 2024 – Oct 31, 2025 \$2,809.08 Nov 1, 2025 – Oct 31, 2026 \$2,865.69,

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a lease agreement, between the Cattaraugus County Community Services Board and Olean Medical Practice, PLLC, to signify the County's approval, for the provision of the above-described leased space, for a term commencing November 1, 2023 and terminating October 31, 2026, according to the above-described terms.

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE CONTRACT WITH CITY OF OLEAN FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR OLEAN AREA TRANSIT SYSTEM (O.A.T.S.) BUS SERVICES

Pursuant to Public Law 104-1993, Section 119-o of the General Municipal Law and Section 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, Act 298-2023 authorized a contract with the City of Olean for the operation of the O.A.T.S. bus service within the City, the term of which expires May 31, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the County Department of Social Services is desirous of continuing the aforementioned bus service within the City of Olean, and

WHEREAS, the City of Olean has agreed to provide the O.A.T.S. bus transportation services to DSS-eligible recipients if the County agrees to reimburse the City an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00 for transportation services provided to DSS-eligible recipients during the period June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025, and

WHEREAS, these services are 100% federally funded (CFDA #93.558), now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a contract, on behalf of Cattaraugus County, with the City of Olean, for reimbursement for the provision of transportation services to DSS-eligible recipients, for a term commencing June 1, 2024 and terminating May 31, 2025, according to the above-described terms, and be it further

RESOLVED, that upon termination of either state or federal funding for this program, then this program shall be automatically abolished, and be it further

RESOLVED, that such contract shall provide that upon the reduction of any such funding, the County, in its sole discretion, may terminate the contract on thirty (30) days' written notice, and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event of any such reduction, the department head involved shall immediately report such occurrence to the Chairman of the Committee to which the department is assigned, who shall add the matter to the agenda of the Committee's next meeting.

# AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE CONTRACT WITH CITY OF OLEAN FOR FUNDING REIMBURSEMENT FOR OLEAN AREA TRANSIT SYSTEM (O.A.T.S.) AND ADJUSTING VARIOUS APPROPRIATION AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS

Pursuant to Public Law 104-1993, Section 119-o of the General Municipal Law and Sections 363, 366 and 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, the City of Olean is the lead sponsor of the Olean Area Transit System (O.A.T.S.), and

WHEREAS, the County is desirous of continuing and supporting the transportation service provided by O.A.T.S. to County constituents, and

WHEREAS, the County has agreed to pay to the City of Olean an amount of \$40,000.00 per month to ensure the continued operation of the O.A.T.S. bus transportation services, and

WHEREAS, the City of Olean shall continue to provide the O.A.T.S. bus transportation services for an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 per month during the period June 1, 2024 through November 30, 2024, with an option for one-month extensions not to exceed three months, and

WHEREAS, the City shall reimburse the County the total amount of payments made by the County to the City upon the City's receipt of funds from the New York State Department of Transportation, and

WHEREAS, various appropriation and revenue accounts must be adjusted in order to cover the cost of the aforementioned services, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a contract, on behalf of Cattaraugus County, with the City of Olean, for the provision of O.A.T.S. bus transportation services, for a term commencing June 1, 2024 and terminating November 30, 2024, with an option of one-month extensions not to exceed three months, according to the above-described terms, and be it further

RESOLVED, that such contract shall provide that either the County or the City may terminate the contract on thirty (30) days' written notice, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Administrator is hereby directed to make the following budgetary changes:

WHEREAS, Mr. Couture was an FFA Advisor and earned many Empire and American FFA degrees, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Couture earned a Bachelor's Degree in Soil Science from Michigan University and did graduate work at Cornell University, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Couture is survived by his wife of 58 years, Phyllis; his children: Curt of Oneida; Brian of Colchester, Connecticut; and Stacy Taylor of Panama; three siblings; eight grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews, and

WHEREAS, the loss of his presence will be sadly felt by his many friends and colleagues in Cattaraugus County, now, therefore, Legislators Boberg, Brisky, Helmich and Schröder hereby
